

## **\*Great Night For Kart Racing\***

After the tries by mother nature in past couple weeks once again The Cornwall Karting Club runs on a Thursday night make up date to get the weeks event in.

With the start of pints for the 2008 season coming up fast all drivers and teams alike are busy getting the best possible set-ups for each race machine. With the Cornwall Karting Club you could see teams talking it up and comparing set ups and information to make sure they get best possible performance and also to make sure they are within the WKA rules and regulations. Some of these are as follows...

\*Soda bottles: \*They will not be permitted to be used as a catch can for your overflow.

- \*Loose Debris: \*No loose debris will be permitted in any kart entering the track surface. Any unacceptable debris falling of a kart at any time during hot laps, qualifying or feature events may face disqualification. Please check and double check your kart before making your way to the staging lane.

: Our tech inspector will verify engines from time to time with the guidelines in the WKA rule book.

- \*Disqualification: \*At any time that a kart is deemed illegal or not suitable for racing, the kart and driver must present themselves to the head tech inspector to show that the problem has been rectified. In the case of a motor disqualification, the kart must be inspected the following week before the driver is allowed to compete. Receivers: Are mandatory for the Stock Classes effective the first points night June 24<sup>th</sup> 2008. (no exceptions)

Bumpers: Loop style bumpers minimum 4 to 5 inches on the outside of frame rails maximum with no wider than out side tire. Track Management and Karting officials may change rules if it is a safety factor to insure the safest racing event for drivers and fans alike.

With the cooler temperatures then in previous days the track was fast and tacky and teams made necessary changes for the heat events started. The heat action was fast and very few cautions during all of the heats. Which was a sure tell tale of what was to come feature time.

In feature action this week the \$d of Dominic Pont fights hard and comes out victorious in the box stock class. The good part was after the race as Dominic drives into the winners circle and jumps out of his race machine and puts on a victory dance that I am sure Carl Edwards would approve of.

The Rookie One feature was taken by the 24 of Justin Locke and the KC1 of Kacey Neville was back in the winners circle for his first feature event of 2008 in the Jr Sportsman class.
